

Joseph V. Farrar, Jr. January 26, 1925- December 28, 2010

Major Joseph Vernon Farrar, Jr., USAF (Ret). passed away at his home at Aguanga, California, Riverside County, on December 28th, 2010. He was born in Florence, Alabama on January 26, 1925, the oldest of 10 brothers and sisters. He enlisted in the Navy during WWII in June of 1942 (age 17) and served until April, 1946 as an enlisted man on several ships including one that was lost in battle during the invasion of Salarno, Italy in 1943. After the war he married Florence Cianflone and entered the cadet training program of the newly formed US Air Force. He became an officer and pilot and flew many different combat airplanes including tactical medium bombers during his over 20 years in the military, retiring as Major in 1964. After his Air Force career and subsequent divorce he spent his time in South Carolina and Georgia working as a salesman in land development and as a real estate investor. He retired again in 1978 and started traveling. He spent the next years of his life traveling the country in his Lincoln Continental pulling his now vintage Airstream travel trailer, visiting family, researching and learning more about his genealogy and promoting a family reunion on his brothers property in the backwoods of Arkansas that is held annually and is still well attended even after 30 years. He also had time for several projects including a flight school for ultralight airplanes in Riverside County and managing a cafe and gas station. owned by his son in the Southern California desert. Even after parking his Airstream and residing in it on his lot at the Jojoba Hills Escapee RV Park in Aguanga, California he spent his time completing his 'to do' list which included an RV trip to Alaska, a freighter cruise around the world at age 80, and an exploration of the Holy Land to learn more about his faith. The man who always wore black spent his final years traveling each summer in his little RV and visiting and spending time with his immediate family. He lived a simple life but a full and active one up to the very end. He is survived by his two sons, Ron Farrar of Medford, Oregon and Randy Farrar of San Diego, CA (and their significant others), two granddaughters, Bernadine Visentin and Reagine Farrar and two great grand children, Justin Visentin and Dakota Farrar, seven brothers and sisters and almost 30 nieces and nephews.

Furnished: large ice chest for food storage, ice for drinks (not for private coolers); propane oven; all cooking utensils, bowls & flatware, paper plates & bowls; napkins, salt, pepper, catsup, mustard, sugar, creamer, coffee, tea, toilet paper, paper towels. Provided by Reunion: Regular Thousand Island, Ranch, Italian dressings. If you prefer something different bring your favorite. Breakfast: Cooked by earlier risers. Scrambled eggs, bacon, sausage, pancakes, fried potatoes, sliced fruit, toast, butter, jellies/jams, any pastries and/or homemade items brought. Bring what your family would eat of these items for the days you are attending. Not all items will be fixed everyday. Example: if pancakes are fixed, we would not fix potatoes.

Feel free to bring and share any of your favorite side dishes for any meal.

Nightly desserts/ snacks: whatever you wish to bring or make

Lunch and/or in-between meal snacks is whatever you bring for your family. As a general rule, you are on your own, but feel free to chow down on leftovers from the previous suppers.

Please bring portions for your family only AND only for the days you are attending. Write your name on stuff you bring. Take it home with you when you leave if it has not been used. This will help eliminate waste at the end of the week.

Be sure to put your name on dishes that need to be returned to you after use.

Canoe trip: peanut butter & jelly sandwiches, chips, fruit, cookies, water, soda. (Note: Doug and Patty will supply PB & J)

Beef or pork steak (you cook on the grill the way you like it)

1 Box of packaged onion soup mix (i.e.: Lipton's)

Canned cut green beans

Potatoes

2 Cucumbers 1 small onion (cucumber/onion salad)

Jiffy Corn bread mix

Monday

Chicken on the grill. You grill the way you like it

Stir fry veggies (prepackaged bag)

Pasta salad (Reunion will supply)

Can or jar of chunky applesauce

Tuesday

Beef tips and noodles (please pre-cut meat into bite size pieces)

-Note: Reunion will supply the noodles

2cans beef broth

1 Box of packaged onion soup mix (i.e.: Lipton's)

Corn on the cob (already shucked and cleaned)

Fruit salad (prepackaged, fresh cut-up, or canned is fine)

Wednesday

Goulash (bring hamburger, enough for your family)

-Note: Reunion will supply the macaroni

Pkg. dry sloppy joe mix- one pkg per pound of hamburger you bring

1 large can diced tomatoes

(Wednesday Continued)

Small green pepper

Cole slaw (prepackaged shredded). -Note: Reunion will supply the dressing.
